

Advanced Certificate Program in Medical Education

Information Sheet

Participants: The certificate program is designed for doctors who assume, or are interested in, educational leadership roles and responsibilities. They might be teachers or directors of programs, fellowships, residencies, clerkships and/or undergraduate ME, GME and CME. Participants will build medical education skills in facilitating adult learning, mentoring and coaching, giving feedback, gaining leadership self-awareness and capabilities, assessing and evaluating programs, and developing healthy learning environments in their organizations and communities. They will collaboratively learn with and from one another as they tackle current challenges of their choice.

Design: Cohort of participating doctors

Four Integrated Modules delivered in blended onsite and asynchronous on line modes

1 Saturday a month, 4 Fall Semester and 4 Spring= 10 graduate credits

(can be applied to: MA, EdM and EdD degree programs in Adult Learning & Leadership)

Faculty: Courses will be taught by faculty in the Program of Adult Learning and Leadership,
Department of Organization and Leadership. Faculty have subject matter expertise and an array of healthcare
institution and professional development experience. Each instructor will be joined by a dedicated physician
partner who assists in keeping the curriculum relevant and up to date in its applications. An advisory board,
comprised of renowned medical educators, will provide ongoing guidance and assistance to the program and
its community of physician scholars as it grows and evolves.

Tuition: Credits and Fees – estimated to be between \$18,000-20,000

Fall: Facilitating Adult Learning (3 credits) & Leadership and Self Development (2 credits)

Spring: Action Learning Design and Coaching (3 credits) & Learning Communities (2 credits)
